Intended use

Your BLACK+DECKER BDC2A charger has been designed for charging BLACK+DECKER 18V Li-lon and 54V DUALVŎLŤ Li-lon battery packs. This appliance is intended for consumer use only.

Safety instructions

General safety warnings Warning! Read all safety warnings and all instructions.

> Failure to follow the warnings and instructions listed below may result in electric shock, fire and/or serious injury.



Warning! When using battery powered appliances, basic safety precautions, including the following, should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, leaking batteries, personal injury and material damage.

Separate collection of used products and packaging allows materials to be recycled and used again. Re-use of recycled materials helps prevent environmental pollution and reduces the demand for raw materials.

- Read all of this manual carefully before operating the appliance.
- The intended use is described in this manual. The use of any accessory or attachment or the performance of any operation with this appliance other than those recommended in this instruction manual may present a risk of personal injury.
- Retain this manual for future reference.

Using your appliance

- Always take care when using the appliance.
- This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children shall not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children without supervision.
- Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children without supervision.
- The appliance is not to be used as a tov.
- Use in a dry location only. do not allow the appliance to become wet.
- Do not immerse the appliance in water.
- Do not open body casing. There are no user serviceable parts inside.
- Do not operate the appliance in explosive atmospheres, such as in the presence of flammable liquids, gases or dust.
- To reduce the risk of damage to plugs. and cords never pull the cable to remove the plug from a socket outlet.

After use

- When not in use, the appliance should be stored in a dry, well ventilated place out of reach of children.
- Children should not have access to stored appliances.

 When the appliance is stored or transported in a vehicle it should be placed in the boot or restrained to prevent movement following sudden changes in speed or direction.

Inspection and repairs

- Before use, check the appliance for damaged or defective parts.
 Check for breakage of parts and any other conditions that may affect its operation.
- Do not use the appliance if any part is damaged or defective.
- Have any damaged or defective parts repaired or replaced by an authorised repair agent.
- Never attempt to remove or replace any parts other than those specified in this manual.

Power cord safety

 Warning!Never alter the ac power cord or plug. If it will not fit, have a proper outlet installed by a qualified electrician. Improper connection may result in an electric shock.

Additional safety instructions for batteries and chargers

Batteries

- Never attempt to open for any reason.
- Do not expose the battery to water.
- Do not store in locations where the temperature may exceed 40 °C.
- Charge only at ambient temperatures between 10 °C and 40 °C.
- Charge only using the charger provided with the appliance/tool. Using the wrong charger could result in an electric shock or overheating of the battery.

- When disposing of batteries, follow the instructions given in the section "Protecting the environment".
- Do not damage/deform the battery pack either by puncture or impact, as this may create a risk of injury and fire.
- Do not charge damaged batteries.
- Under extreme conditions, battery leakage may occur. When you notice liquid on the batteries carefully wipe the liquid off using a cloth. Avoid skin contact.
- In case of skin or eye contact, follow the instructions below.

Warning! The battery fluid may cause personal injury or damage to property. In case of skin contact, immediately rinse with water. If redness, pain or irritation occurs seek medical attention. In case of eye contact, rinse immediately with clean water and seek medical attention

Chargers

Your charger has been designed for a specific voltage. Always check that the mains voltage corresponds to the voltage on the rating plate.

Warning! Never attempt to replace the charger unit with a regular mains plug.

- Use your BLACK+DECKER charger only to charge the battery in the appliance/tool with which it was supplied. Other batteries could burst, causing personal injury and damage.
- Never attempt to charge nonrechargeable batteries.
- If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer or an authorised BLACK+DECKER Service Centre in order to avoid a hazard.
- Do not expose the charger to water.
- Do not open the charger.
- Do not probe the charger.

 The charger must be placed in a well ventilated area when charging.

Residual risks

Additional residual risks may arise when using the tool which may not be included in the enclosed safety warnings. These risks can arise from misuse, prolonged use etc. Even with the application of the relevant safety regulations and the implementation of safety devices, certain residual risks can not be avoided. These include:

- Injuries caused by touching any rotating/moving parts.
- Injuries caused when changing any parts, blades or accessories.
- Injuries caused by prolonged use of a tool. When using any tool for prolonged periods ensure you take regular breaks.
- Impairment of hearing.
- Health hazards caused by breathing dust developed when using your tool (example:- working with wood, especially oak, beech and MDF.)

Symbols on the charger

The following symbols are shown on the appliance along with the date code:



Electrical safety

Features

This appliance includes some or all of the following features.

- Charger
- 2. Charging indicator

Assembly

Warning! Before assembly, remove the battery from the appliance/tool.

Fitting and removing the battery

- To fit the battery, line it up with the receptacle on the tool. Slide the battery into the receptacle and push until the battery snaps into place.
- To remove the battery, push the battery release button while at the same time pulling the battery out of the receptacle.

Warning! Let the tool work at its own pace. Do not overload.

Charging the battery

The battery needs to be charged before first use and whenever it fails to produce sufficient power on jobs that were easily done before. The battery may become warm while charging; this is normal and does not indicate a problem.

Warning! Do not charge the battery at ambient temperatures below 10 °C or above 40 °C. Recommended charging temperature: approx. 24 °C.

Note: The charger will not charge a battery if the cell temperature is below approximately 10°C or above 40 °C. The battery should be left in the charger and the charger will begin to charge automatically when the cell temperature warms up or cools down.

- To charge the battery, insert it into the charger (1). The battery will only fit into the charger in one way. Do not force. Be sure that the battery is fully seated in the charger.
- Plug in the charger and switch on at the mains.
 The charging indicator (2) will blink.

The charge is complete when the charging indicator (2) switches to continuously on. The charger and the battery can be left connected indefinitely.

The LED will switch on as the charger occasionally tops up the battery charge.



(Original instructions)

Charge discharged batteries within 1 week.
 Battery life will be greatly diminished if stored in a discharged state.

Leaving the battery in the charger

The charger and battery pack can be left connected with the LED glowing indefinitely. The charger will keep the battery pack fresh and fully charged.

Maintenance

Your BLACK+DECKER tool has been designed to operate over a long period of time with a minimum of maintenance. Continuous satisfactory operation depends upon proper tool care and regular cleaning.

Your charger does not require any maintenance apart from regular cleaning.

Warning! Before performing any maintenance on the tool, remove the battery from the tool. Unplug the charger before cleaning it.

- Regularly clean the ventilation slots in your tool and charger using a soft brush or dry cloth.
- Regularly clean the motor housing using a damp cloth.
- ◆ Do not use any abrasive or solvent-based cleaner.
